How we use your personal information

We collect information about you in order to:

- deliver services to you
- perform our contract with you
- carry out identity and anti-money laundering checks
- ensure we are providing appropriate services to you
- provide you with information, products or services that you request from us or which we feel may interest you
- notify you about changes to our services
- comply with our legal obligations
- to collect information from credit reference agencies and fraud prevention agencies
- maintain our records for administrative purposes

Where we are required to obtain your consent for any of the above, we will obtain it. Otherwise, we will be relying on our legitimate business interests to use your data, or using your data to perform our contract with you or comply with our legal obligations.

Lawful basis for the processing

Most processing is carried out to comply with our legal obligations under statute and other regulatory obligations related to the insolvency process. We also believe our processing is for the legitimate interests of all stakeholders in the insolvency process, as

they are entitled to be kept informed and may wish to engage in the insolvency process. Where North Insolvency Ltd has engaged with a client to perform a service, we will be required to process data to provide the service in accordance with the contractual terms.

We collect information about you when you register with us or engage us to provide products or services, or otherwise when you do business with us. We also collect information when you voluntarily

business with us. We also collect information when you voluntarily complete customer surveys, provide feedback and participate in competitions. We will collect some or all of the following information from you:

- Your name
- Your postal and email address and telephone number(s)
- Your date of birth
- Financial information including taxation affairs and you National Insurance number
- Your family members
- Information relevant to the [products or] services you engage is to provide
- Information relevant to the products or services you provide to us
- Information you provide to us when you register for events or to receive other communications from us
- We may also obtain information about you from other sources in order to help us provide the required services or comply with our legal and regulatory obligations, for example for anti-money laundering purposes
- Your internet protocol address, operating system and web browser of visitors to our website. The IP address indicates the location of your computer on the Internet and may be used to provide statistical information about the users of our website. This information does not include data identifying you as an individual
- Website usage information is collected using cookies please see our cookie policy for further details.

If you share other people's data with us, you will need to check that person consents to you providing that information to us.

Who we share our data with

We may use third parties located in other countries to help us run our business. As a result, personal data may be transferred outside the countries where we and our clients are located. In addition, as part of our statutory duties, we may be required to share some personal data with government agencies (e.g. Companies House and the Insolvency Service) and this may result in some data being made available by these agencies in the public domain. We will only fulfil requests for personal data where we are permitted to do so in accordance with applicable law or regulation.
